Hinduism	<b>Hinduism</b> is a religion of many gods. However, all <b>Hindus</b> worship one supreme being who created a bunch of gods to be his helpers.
Brahman	The supreme God who controls everything.
Vishnu	The God that protects and preserves the earth.
Shiva	The God that destroys things that are old and not needed in order for new things to happen.
Brahma	The creator
Trimutri	The manifestation of the supreme God Brahman in three forms (Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva)
Dharma	The duties that you have during your life.
Diwali	The festival of lights that celebrates the story of Rama and Sita.
Varna	The main classes in Hindu Society
Karma	The belief that how you act in your life affects your next life.
Vedas	Books of spiritual knowledge. They are called the Vedas from the root of Vid which means to know.
Swamis/ Gurus	Spiritual teacher
Dharma	Practising right conduct in religious and social duties.
Antha	Earning material wealth by honest means and providing for family and society
Kama	Enjoying the pleasures and beauty of life.
Moksha	Aiming for the final goal of release from round of rebirth and attaining liberation
