

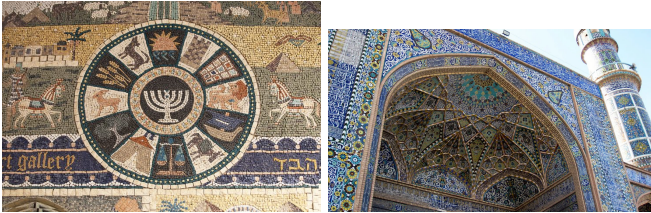


Focus Religion:

Vocabulary	
Judaism	Judaism is the world's oldest Abrahamic religion. There are about 15 million followers who are called Jews.
Islam	A religion based on belief in Allah as the only God and in Muhammad the prophet of God. Other Words from Islam.
Torah	Jewish holy book is written in the language of Hebrew.
Hanukkah	A Jewish festival that runs for eight days in December in which a special candle is lit each night.
Rabbi	A Jewish holy man who takes the service in a Synagogue.
Passover	A Jewish holiday that celebrates the escape of the ancient Hebrews from Egypt
Synagogue	Jewish place of worship.
Star of David	The Jewish symbol, named after the Jewish King David.
Shabbat	The most important day in the Jewish calendar.
Mosque	A mosque is a place of prayer for Muslims, or followers of the religion of Islam
5 Pillars of Islam	The five bases of the Islamic faith: shahada (confession of faith), salat (prayer), zakat (almsgiving), sawm (fasting, especially during the month of Ramadan), and hajj (the pilgrimage to Mecca)
